⁵ A potential conflict of interest is understood as a relationship between the Author and an entity (including a public office, entrepreneur or private person) that is directly interested in or benefits from the adoption of a specific interpretation of the law, consisting in:

- (1) work for such an entity during the preparation of the manuscript or within the last three years, in particular if the paper submitted is a copy or a modified version of a document used in official legal proceedings (e.g. a brief) or is a copy or a modified version of a legal opinion prepared for the given entity;
- (2) participation in the decision of a court or other body which is analyzed in the publication;
- (3) using the funds of a given entity to conduct current or past research (up to three years ago), including research that is the subject of the paper.

⁶ Correct anonymization of a manuscript includes in particular:

- (1) removing from the paper any data identifying the author, such as name, surname, ORCID number, affiliation, acknowledgements or information on funding;
